Arts and Culture Six-Year Awards	Those students committed to the arts initiatives for their 6 years at the college are eligible for this award.	College
Cultural Medals	Awarded to students based on their involvement, commitment, and performance across the arts disciplines. Acknowledges students who have made the most significant contribution to the Arts in 2022. Top 3 students recognised.	Awards Evening
Visual Arts Award	The Visual Art award is dedicated to a student who has participated in co-curricular art exhibitions, programs and who demonstrates skill and expertise in the field.	Awards Evening
